Dear Ms. Hofmann:

I am responding to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of December 18, 2007, to the Justice Management Division (JMD), in which you seek "all records in the Justice Department Retrieval and Inquiry System (JURIS) database," "any communications between the Department of Justice (DOJ) and University of Pennsylvania Linguistic Data Consortium concerning the JURIS database" and "any internal DOJ memoranda, opinion, statements or other documents discussing commercial restrictions on reuse of data in the JURIS database."

The Department operated JURIS from the 1970s until 1993. JURIS consisted of materials licensed to the Department by the West Publishing Company and materials provided by the Department and other Federal agencies. In 1994, Tax Analysts brought suit under the FOIA seeking the materials licensed by West that were included in JURIS. The court concluded that the materials provided by West were not agency records and sustained the Department's denial of Tax Analysts' FOIA request. See Tax Analysts v. U.S. Dept of Justice, 913 F.Supp 599 (D.D.C. 1996), aff'd 107 F.3rd 923 (D.C. Cir. Jan. 21, 1997), rehearing denied (April 10, 1997), cert. denied 522 U.S. 931 (1997). Portions of the JURIS data base that were provided to JURIS by Federal agencies, on the other hand, were made available to FOIA requesters in the 1990's.

With respect to item 1 of your request, the Department no longer maintains the contents of the JURIS database. In addition, JMD has not retained paper or electronic copies of the materials provided to FOIA requesters in the 1990s. Therefore, we have no documents responsive to item 1 of your request.

With respect to item 2 of your request, the Justice Management Division has conducted a search of its files and has not located copies of any correspondence or other communication that it may have had with the University of Pennsylvania Linguistic Data Consortium concerning the JURIS database.

With respect to item 3 of your request, it is not clear what information you seek in asking for documents "discussing commercial restrictions on reuse of data in the JURIS database." If you

are asking for records explaining why the Department did not make the West licensed materials available to FOIA requesters, we have located one letter to a FOIA requester from the 1990s that identifies the materials that were made available and explains what was withheld and why. We are providing it at no cost. If you are asking whether the Department considered or placed any restrictions on reuse of the electronic files it may have provided to the University of Pennsylvania Linguistic Data Consortium, as noted in the response to item 2, we have no records of communications with the University of Pennsylvania Linguistic Data Consortium. I note that it is not our practice to place restrictions on reuse of documents provided to FOIA requesters.

If you find this response inadequate you may file an appeal. If you choose to appeal, you must do so in writing to the Attorney General within 60 days. Your appeal should be addressed to the Director, Office of Information and Privacy, United States Department of Justice, Suite 11050, 1425 New York Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20530. Both the envelope and the letter should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal." If you appeal and the decision is upheld, you may seek judicial review in the United States District Court for the judicial district in which you reside or have your principal place or business, or the District of Columbia.

Dear Mr. Rosenfeld:

I am responding to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated September 20, 1996, and your subsequent letters of December 4, 1996, and February 7, 1997, in which you request "permission to inspect and copy the magnetic tapes containing the contents of the JURIS system . . . " As you undoubtedly know, the magnetic tapes you seek in your FOIA request are the subject of a lawsuit filed by Tax Analysts, Inc., which is pending before the United States District Court for the District of Columbia (Tax Analysts, Inc. v. Department of Justice, et al., Civil Action No. GK94-0043). In that lawsuit, Tax Analysts seeks release of the contents of the JURIS database, in particular the portions of JURIS provided by West Publishing Company.

As you are aware, the magnetic tapes of JURIS data sought by your organization, Tax Analysts, and other FOIA requesters contain a wide variety of material amounting to millions of pages of, among other things, case law, statutory law, treaties, administrative law, government manuals, brief banks, digest material, investigative materials, deposition and trial transcripts, attorney work product files, and advice to clients. These materials were contributed to JURIS from over 50 different entities, including Department of Justice components, other federal agencies, and commercial publishers.

Nevertheless, a few years ago, the Department of Justice made the decision to release much of the JURIS database on magnetic tape to the public without regard to whether any releases would be required under the FOIA. Consequently, the Department's Justice Management Division ("JMD") has coordinated with the contributing agencies and components as they determine what JURIS materials they will authorize JMD to release. The attached price lists set forth those JURIS files that are available to the public, as well as the cost for the tape copies of those files. It is my understanding that these lists were provided to you several months ago by our Systems Technology Staff. If you wish to receive copies of any of the listed files, please submit a letter identifying the requested files and provide payment, including

With respect to the rest of the JURIS data currently housed on the magnetic tape, your request is denied for several reasons. First, such a request imposes an unreasonable burden on the Department in that it would require it to locate, review, redact and arrange for inspection a vast quantity of data from over 50 different contributors. As a result, a request for the JURIS database is an impermissibly broad FOIA request that does not reasonably describe a class of documents subject to disclosure as required by 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(3)(A).

Second, much of the data contributed to JURIS, including data contributed by West Publishing Company ("West"), CCH, Inc., and the Department of the Air Force, constitute collections of library reference materials. Thus, to the extent your request seeks these library reference collections, it is denied because such collections are not "agency records" subject to the FOIA. SDC Development Corporation v. Mathews, 642 F.2d 1116 (9th Cir. 1976); Baizer v. Department of the Air Force, 887 F. Supp. 225 (N.D. Cal. 1995).

Third, all data provided under licensing agreements to the Department by West and CCH are not "agency records" subject to the FOIA, because the Department does not have legal control over the data. Pursuant to the licensing agreements with West and CCH, the Department obtained limited rights to use West and CCH data on JURIS. Both commercial publishers, however, retained

Nonetheless, as we have done with all other FOIA requests seeking release of the JURIS databases, we intend to forward your request to those contributing components and agencies that have, for various reasons, withheld from JMD authorization to release certain JURIS files. This will help ensure that if these components or agencies authorize discretionary releases in the future, they can inform you directly. It will also allow them to assert any FOIA exemptions that they may have that are not asserted in this letter. Specifically, your request will be forwarded to the following Department of Justice components: Office of Legal Counsel, Executive Office for United States Attorneys, Criminal Division, Federal Bureau of Investigation, Civil Division, and the Environmental and Natural Resources Division; and to the following agencies: Department of the Air Force, Department of Education, Department of Health and Human Services, the United States Postal Service, and Board of Governors for the Federal Reserve System.

ownership and legal control of the data, prohibiting the Department from releasing the data to third parties and significantly restricting the Department's use and transfer of the licensed data. As a licensee, the Department does not have legal authority to release these materials to third parties under the FOIA. Therefore, the licensed data does not constitute an "agency record." Tax Analysts, Inc. v. Department of Justice, 492 U.S. 136, 144-45 (1992); Tax Analysts, Inc. v. Department of Justice, 913 F. Supp. 599 (D.D.C. 1996), affirmed per curiam, 1997 WL 71746 (D.C. Cir. January 21, 1997).

Finally, even if the licensed data were subject to the FOIA, the data would be exempt from disclosure under FOIA Exemption 4, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(4), because of the obvious harm to West and CCH, from whom we obtain the data, as well as the harm to the government. Exemption 4 provides that the FOIA does not apply to matters that are (1) commercial or financial information, (2) obtained from a person, and (3) privileged or confidential. These three requirements are conjunctive. National Parks and Conservation Ass'n v. Morton, 498 F.2d 765, 766 (D.C. Cir. 1974). All apply in this case. (1) The information from West and CCH is West and CCH are in the business of commercial information. selling access to their databases through an online service and in hard copy in the form of case reporter series and other books. (2) A corporation is considered a "person" within the meaning of the FOIA. (3) The databases are confidential.

To determine if information is confidential requires an analysis of whether release will either, "impair the Government's ability to obtain necessary information in the future," or "cause potential harm to the competitive position of the person from whom the information was obtained," National Parks, 498 F.2d at 770. Under both tests the information must be withheld. First, if the Department were to release the databases under FOIA in violation of its agreements with West and CCH, no (or very few) contractors who are providers of information, be it data or software programs, would be willing to contract with us. Second, there can be no doubt that release of databases would cause West and CCH substantial competitive harm. West and CCH commercially market the information in the databases. If the databases were made available by the Department under FOIA, West and CCH likely would lose a significant portion of their current business.

You may appeal the denial of your request. (I do not have the authority to treat your letter of February 7, 1997 as an appeal.) If you choose to file an appeal, you must do so in writing to the Attorney General within 30 days of your receipt of this letter. Your appeal should be addressed to the Co-Director, Office of Information and Privacy, United States Department of Justice, Flag Building, Suite 570, Washington, D.C. 20530. Both the envelope and the letter should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal." If you appeal, and the decision is

upheld, you may seek judicial review in the United States District Court for the judicial district in which you reside or have your principal place of business, or the District of Columbia.
